APPENDIX K CHURCH BULLETIN SEPTEMBER 29, 1940.

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church

766 Boulevard, N. E.

May 9, 1922, Wednesday night, our Church was organized in the Majestic Hotel Building with Elders Geo. D. Goddard and Walter M. Blackwell as presbytery. There were thirteen members, and Elder Blackwell was called as first pastor; services to be held each Sunday.

July 1, 1922, the Church moved its place of worship to the North Avenue School Building.

October 13, 1922, the lot at 766 Boulevard, N. E., was bought for \$3,000 and the building contract given the same day.

November 19, 1922, the dedication service was held.

October 1, 1925, Elder V. F. Agan was called as pastor, the Church to have services two Sundays each month.

September 6, 1928, Elder Wm. H. Crouse was called to the pastorate of the Church, services to be the third Sunday of each month.

August 19, 1933, the Church began holding services in the Glazener Memorial Church Building, having leased their building to others. This arrangement continued through July, 1939, with the exception of nine months beginning November, 1934, when services were held in the Junior Order Hall on Capitol Avenue.

August 16, 1939, designated as Home-Coming Day, found the Church back in their building on Boulevard, having been away six years.

From August, 1939, through September, 1940, the Church used supply preachers.

September 29, 1940, Elder V. F. Agan begins his pastorate with the Church much revived in spirit and zeal, having learned over again the great value of a permanent church home and pastor.

Dear Mr. Hicks:

This will confirm the verbal agreement reached by the Committee at their last meeting on Saturday, July 12, 1958. It was agreed that M. W. Buttrill would reinstate the limestone at a price of \$605.00 and install the ground floor slab at a price of \$1,500.00. It was also agreed that a contract would be signed with the Atlanta Gas Light Company to install air-conditioning in both the ground floor and first floor of the Educational Building and in the Sanctuary. The cost of this air-conditioning is to be approximately \$4,000.00 more than the price of the heating as set up in Mr. Buttrill's original estimate.

As you know, the contract with the Gas Company amounts to \$11,485.00 for the complete system. Mr. Cannon, in discussing the air-conditioning with Mr. F. R. Little, Jr., of the Gas Company, advised Mr. Little that the Church funds were limited and that the air-conditioning system was to be installed as economically as possible. Mr. Cannon also advised Mr. Little that the average attendance in the Sanctuary would be 179 persons.

We have had our engineers check the specifications and plans of the Gas Company and have been advised by them that the air-conditioning system as proposed will provide for adequate air-conditioning on all but extremely hot days and unless the Sanctuary is filled to capacity on a hot day. In such an event, the cooling would not be what is generally considered as adequate. It would be possible, however, to pre-cool the Sanctuary on extremely hot days and reduce the possibility of the congregation being uncomfortable on these days.

We are enclosing a copy of a letter from Mr. Little of the Gas Company in which they propose to make revisions for an additional five tons of air-conditioning for the Sanctuary without any further duct work changes or other structural changes. We believe it would be wise to invest this \$250.00 and in the event that the congregation feels that the Sanctuary is inadequate, during the next cooling cycle or next summer it would be very simple to install the additional tonnage at that time. We would appreciate it if you would discuss this with the other members of the Committee and advise us on the matter.

We are enclosing a copy of a letter to Geffken-Austin and Associates, our electrical consultants on your work, which is self-explanatory. As soon as we have a price from Mr. Buttrill for the conduit required for the dimmer, we will advise you accordingly.

If we can be of any further service, please do not hesitate to call on us.

At a meeting of the Building Committee of the Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church on July 12, 1958, we were advised that it would be impossible to use the existing fixtures from the old church building. These fixtures were sold with the church so it will be necessary to go back to the original fixtures planned for the new building. We are, by copy of this letter, advising M. W. Buttrill, the General Contractor, of this situation and direct that he take the necessary steps to see that the ceiling lighting for the Sanctuary is as planned.

With regard to the dimmer, the Building Committee agreed to install empty conduit which would provide for the future installation of the motor operated dimmer. Will you please advise Mr. Williams, the subcontractor, what will be required and we are also, by copy of this letter, asking Mr. Buttrill to ascertain the cost of the additional conduit.

Gentlemen:

For your consideration and approval, we submit the following changes in the heating and air conditioning system of the Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church.

Heating and Air Conditioning will be supplied to both floors of the Educational Building and to the Sanctuary in accordance with the original building plans.

The air distribution system for the Sanctuary will be enlarged to accommodate an additional 2,000 cfm. The four 18" ceiling diffusers will be increased to 20". The 12" ceiling diffuser will be increased to 18". These changes will permit the installation of five additional tons of air conditioning without further duct work changes.

We will make the above mentioned changes in the air distribution system for the sum of - \$250.00, plus Georgia Sales Tax of \$3.00.

Please let us know if we can furnish additional information.
