January 22, 2006

REGULAR CONFERENCE

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church met in regular conference on January 22, 2006, following the morning worship service and lunch. The church was called into conference with Brother Wade as moderator. Brother Wade offered prayer.

The minutes of the previous conference were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was given. We began the period with \$10,200 in checking and took in \$68,273. We spent \$59,599, giving us an ending balance of \$18,874. The report was approved as given. Brother Mark gave a report on the church's investment account, which had a balance of \$275,520 as if January 1, 2006. Money had been taken from our money market account to help pay for the carpet and pews.

Correspondence:

Simms -- A thank you note from Elder and Sister Simms for their Christmas gift was read.

Egleston -- We received a thank you note from Egleston Children's Hospital for the Christmas gifts for the children.

Smith-Barney -- We received a note advising that Smith-Barney had made a donation to the American Heart Association on our behalf.

Old Business:

Medicare Seminar -- A Medicare seminar on the new changes that have taken place is still available to our seniors. However, after some discussion it was determined that there is not enough interest to hold one at this time.

Virginia Hodgson Benevolence -- The church's commitment of benevolence to Sister Virginia Hodgson has expired. The church is now liable for around \$1,350 in damages from the condition in which she left the apartment that the church had helped her get into.

New Business:

Primitive Baptist Foundation Director -- The church needs to elect a director and an alternate for the Primitive Baptist Foundation for the coming year. Brothers Clay and Glenn, respectively, have served in the past. A motion was made to reelect these brethren for 2006. It passed.

Fall Meeting -- The church needs to call a pastor to preach our 2006 Fall Meeting. The floor was opened for nominations. Elders Lavon Anderson and Jim McGill were nominated. With no further nominations the floor was closed. A motion was made and passed to proceed with a vote. A vote was taken with the following results:

Lavon Anderson	17
Jim McGill	13

The call will be extended to Elder Lavon Anderson. A letter will be sent and Elder Pat will contact Elder Anderson by phone. A motion was made and passed to have a separate Fall Meeting and Homecoming. A motion was made to have our Fall Meeting during the 3rd or 4th weekend in September and our Homecoming during the 4th weekend in October. It passed.

Discretionary Spending for the Deacons -- The discretionary spending level for the deacons is set at \$500. There was some discussion as to whether this amount should be increased. It was decided that the spending level will be left at \$500.

Water Heater -- The church does not have adequate hot water to warm our baptismal pool. It appears that our current water heater may not be working properly. It is a 100-gallon commercial water heater. The replacement cost would be around \$3000. A motion was made to have the deacons gather estimates on the different options to correct this problem. It passed.

Bible Conference -- The Bible Conference needs hosts for 2009 and 2010. Is the church interested in signing up to host one of these years? Brother Clay felt that the church should step up and host. A motion was made and passed to have our church host the conference in 2009. A volunteer is needed to head up the conference. Brother Clay agreed to accept this job.

New Bosnian Family -- We have a new Bosnian Family that has been visiting our church and is in need of financial assistance. They currently need help with their rent for January, which is \$650. A motion was made and passed to donate \$650 for their January rent.

Carpet -- The Interior decorating committee is looking at additional carpeting for the stairwells and upstairs, and the nursery. They have an estimate of \$11,164. Some remnants from the sanctuary carpet can be used which should decrease this amount. A motion was made and passed to go ahead with the installation of this additional carpeting. A motion was made to have a fundraising day to help raise money for this carpeting project in the form of a Spaghetti Lunch on February 12, planned by Sister Susan. It passed.

Gutters -- The gutters of the church need to be looked at to determine if they are stopped up, or if there is some other problem. A motion was made to have Brother Al, assisted by Brother Terry, to check out the gutters under the direction of the deacons. It passed.

With no further discussion, Brother Langley made a motion to adjourn conference. It passed.

ATLANTA PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH

April 23, 2006

REGULAR CONFERENCE

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church met in regular conference on April 23, 2006, following the morning worship service and lunch. The church was called into conference with Brother Wade as moderator. Brother Wade offered prayer.

The minutes of the previous conference were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was given. We began the period with \$18,871 in checking and took in \$25,911. We spent \$38,259, giving us an ending balance of \$6,523. The report was approved as given. Brother Mark gave a report on the church's investment account, which had a balance of \$277,768 as of March 31, 2006. \$5,500 had been taken out of this account, and \$17,000 will be moved to the general checking account this week.

Correspondence:

Lavone Anderson -- We received a letter from Elder Lavone Anderson accepting our invitation to preach our 2006 Fall Meeting during the weekend of September 22-24.

Old Business:

Hot Water -- The deacons are still looking into options for a hot water heater for the church. The possibility of putting a booster heater on the main water line to feed into the baptismal pool was mentioned.

Gutters -- Brothers Terry and Al are going to clean and repair the gutters.

Steeple -- Our church steeple is in need of repair. It has been about 20 years since any work has been done on it. The deacons will be looking into estimates for repairing the current damage.

New Business:

Checking Account -- As our checking account is running low, money will be moved into it from our investment account to build up our general checking.

Alarms -- The church members were asked to please be extra careful in arming and disarming the alarm system, as the police have had to make several trips to the church. The monitor number is to be posted at the phones.

Foundation Meeting -- The Foundation meeting was recently held at our church with 39 directors, 42 proxies, and 12 absent. Brother Clay gave a brief summary of the business conducted at this meeting.

Church sign -- The sign on the front of our church is beginning to peel off. This sign will need to be taken down.

Kitchen sink leak -- There is a leak under the kitchen sink. Brother Morris is going to try to fix this leak before calling in a plumber.

Next Sunday will be set aside to honor Sister Lauren Hudson who will be graduating from high school this year.

With no further discussion, Brother Langley made a motion to adjourn conference. It passed.

ATLANTA PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH
July 16, 2006

REGULAR CONFERENCE

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church met in regular conference on July 16, 2006, following the morning worship service and lunch. The church was called into conference with Brother Wade as moderator. Brother Wade offered prayer.

The minutes of the previous conference were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was given. We began the period with \$6,520 in checking and took in \$35,911. We spent \$26,413, giving us an ending balance of \$16,018. The report was approved as given. Brother Mark gave a report on the church's investment account, which had a balance of \$262,509 as of June 30, 2006. A transfer into the general checking account of \$10,000 was made rather than the \$17,000 originally planned. Our mutual funds have been converted to CD's, which are earning a higher rate of interest at this time.

Correspondence:

Deaconship of Howard Force -- We received a letter from Brother Howard Force requesting that he be placed in emeritus status as a deacon. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to grant this request.

Old Business:

Steeple -- The deacons are still looking into estimates for the steeple work. The cost so far appears to be quite high. If the expense of repair is too great the church may need to go before the historical committee to find out what type of replacement steeple (such as fiberglass) would be acceptable.

New Business:

Church minutes -- The Primitive Baptist ^{Library + Archives} Foundation would like to have copies of our church minutes for their archives. Brother Clay suggested that he could make pictures of the minutes to be sent to Statesboro, which would also give us a digital copy for backup. Does the church give permission to release our records to the ^{Library} Foundation for archive? A motion was made, seconded, and passed to send copies of our minutes to be archived. amended at Oct. 15, 2006 conf.

2006 Budget -- The church was given copies of the proposed 2006 Budget. It was suggested that \$100 of our benevolence be allotted to the Primitive Baptist Scholarship Fund on a yearly basis. A motion was made to include the Scholarship Fund in our budget and to accept the proposed budget for 2006. It passed.

Church Décor -- Mention was made of the nice tables and flower arrangements that have been donated to the church by the Hyler Family and it was suggested that a thank you note be sent for these donations. A motion was made to recognize Sister Cornelia's hard work and contribution to the church at some time during a morning worship service. It passed.

Church growth -- Elder Pat took a moment to express some of his concerns regarding our church and its growth. He asked some of the same questions posed to the church about a year ago in respect to where we are now, where we want to be, and how we intend to get there. The church was asked to prayerfully consider these questions again and examine our level of commitment to church growth. He mentioned in particular the areas of outreach, Bible study, and the home fellowship -- all of which need much greater effort and commitment on the part of the church members.

Nursery Attendant -- It was mentioned that the church has had several young couples with children to visit our church recently, and there is some concern that without a nursery attendant for these children, these couples will not continue to visit. Elder Pat made a motion that the church hire a nursery attendant. It passed. It was suggested that some of the local churches with early services, those who meet on Saturdays, or those who hold Mass at different times might have someone that would be available during our service times. It was also suggested that the ladies of our church might consider setting up a rotating schedule to keep the nursery until an attendant is hired.

In order to draw more attention to our church on Sundays and make it look alive, it was suggested that more members park in the side parking spots. There was also a suggestion to change our church sign message more often.

With no further discussion, Brother Clay made a motion to adjourn conference. It passed.

REGULAR CONFERENCE

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church met in regular conference on October 15, 2006, following the morning worship service and lunch. The church was called into conference with Brother Wade as moderator. Brother Wade offered prayer.

The minutes of the previous conference were read, amended, and approved.

The treasurer's report was given. We began the period with \$16,018 in checking and took in \$20,278. We spent \$24,828, giving us an ending balance of \$11,468. The report was approved as given. Brother Mark gave a report on the church's investment account, which had a balance of \$276,744 as of September 30, 2006. This amount includes a donation that was made by a member. A transfer into the general checking account of \$8,000 was made at the beginning of October.

Correspondence:

Flat Rock Primitive Baptist Church -- We received an invitation from the Flat Rock Church to attend their Fall Meeting, which is being held Tuesday, October 24 -- Thursday, October 26, 2006 at 7:30pm each evening.

Scholarship Fund Day -- We received a notice of Scholarship Fund Day, which is to be held on Sunday, October 29, 2006. Anyone wishing to donate to this cause is encouraged to do so. A reminder will be put in the bulletin.

Old Business:

Church repairs -- The steeple and church sign header need to be fixed, and the deacons are still looking at estimates for these repairs. They are also still looking into updating the hot water heater so that it is capable of servicing the baptismal pool.

Church sign message -- It was suggested that a family might want to take over the job of changing out the message and information on our church sign.

Windowsills -- In cleaning the church, Brother Morris noticed that some of the windowsills are rotting or beginning to rot. This will also need to be looked into for repair.

New Business:

Primitive Western Association -- Northside Church has withdrawn from the Primitive Western Association. Therefore, Brother Clay motioned that we also withdraw from the Association and thereby dissolve it, as Northside and we are the only two churches in the Association. It passed.

Spring Meeting -- The church needs to call a preacher to preach our Spring Meeting. The floor was opened for nominations. Those nominated were Elders Thomas Waters, Jim McGill, and Bill Durrence. A motion was made to close the nominations. It was seconded and passed. A vote was taken with the following results:

REGULAR CONFERENCE

The Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church met in regular conference on January 28, 2007, following the morning worship service and lunch. The church was called into conference with Elder McCoy as moderator. Brother Walter offered prayer.

Jimmy and Lucile Cason requested membership at the Atlanta Church. A vote was taken, and they were accepted into our church membership.

The minutes of the previous conference were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was given. We began the period with \$11,468 in checking and took in \$27,420. We spent \$28,977, giving us an ending balance of \$9,911. The report was approved as given. Brother Mark gave a report on the church's investment account, which had a balance of \$270,764 as of December 29, 2006. The church tentatively adopted our 2006 budget for this year.

Correspondence:

Elder Jim McGill -- We received a letter of acceptance from Elder Jim McGill to preach our 2007 Spring Meeting. He chose the weekend of March 23-25.

Sister Mildred Simms -- We received a note from Sister Mildred thanking the church for the gift she received from the church at Christmas.

The Hudson Family -- A note of thanks was received from the Hudson family for all the sympathy, phone calls, cards, etc. extended by their church family.

Al Dunn -- We received a letter from Brother Al regarding the maintenance issues of the church. He suggested the church get on a regular maintenance schedule of every 6 months. He stated that he will reseal the gutters.

Old Business:

Steeple & Windowsills -- The deacons are currently in the process of collecting estimates for repair or replacement costs on our steeple and windowsills.

Church cleaning -- Sister Teresa would still be willing to clean the church if she could clean every two weeks rather than weekly. This means the membership would have to help more in keeping our church clean. She would like her pay to be raised to \$125 per cleaning visit. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept these conditions. It was mentioned that if the every two-week cleaning schedule is not sufficient, we can always go back to a weekly cleaning schedule.

Nursery Attendant -- The acquiring of a nursery attendant is still being looked into. In the meantime, the ladies of the church will rotate nursery duty on an as-needed basis.

Yard Work -- It was suggested that the job of cleaning the churchyard be offered to Dzemil. A motion was made, seconded and passed to offer him the job. Brother Terry will call him with the job offer.

New Business:

Church outreach -- Rates were obtained for ads in the Druid Hills newspaper, which would be \$612 per year. 4000 papers are mailed out, and 1000 are put in businesses. The Atlanta Journal charges around \$300 for a weekly ad, which reaches many areas. Direct mailers are another consideration, and someone is checking with the post office on addresses for the mailers. A possible outreach project would be to have a Community Cookout with a Gospel Sing, in which those in surrounding neighborhoods could be invited.

Georgia Power Light -- Georgia Power has been contacted about one of our outside lights that is not working, and they are to have it fixed. Please let Brother Ramon know if the light is still not working.

Nominating Committee -- The nominating committee met, and made only a few changes to our current Officers and Committees. The changes presented were:

Jo Bowers to serve as alternate on Beverages

Church reporter to be Brother Walter, with Sister Angela as assistant

Brother Clay as our Foundation Director, with Brother Walter as the alternate

The changes were approved by the church.

Fall Meeting -- The floor was opened for nominations for a preacher to preach our 2007 Fall Meeting. Those nominated were Elder Tommy Waters and Elder Randy Waters. Nominations were closed. A vote was taken with the following results:

Randy Waters 14

With the majority of votes, Elder Randy Waters will be invited to preach our Fall Meeting. The church will request the weekend of either September 14th-16th or September 21st-23rd.

With no further discussion, Brother Langley made a motion to adjourn conference. It passed.

Church Advertising -- The quarterly edition of the Druid Hills local paper is due out now, and has our starting ad in it. Elder McCoy is following up with the Atlanta Journal concerning possible advertising in that paper.

New Business:

Primitive Baptist Foundation Meeting report -- Brother Walter attended the Primitive Baptist Foundation meeting on April 17th. He said the meeting was well attended and that the foundation was doing well financially. He went on to give a brief report of the meeting, and also discussed some of the programs provided by the foundation.

It was asked that Brother Max get this replacement information and report back to the church before work be started. It was suggested that the church hold a short conference next Sunday after church to relay this information. A motion was made and passed to accept the bid from B & L Mitchell. This company had also given an approximate bid of \$2,500 to repair one side of the church windows. There was no amount available for repair of both sides. A motion was made and passed to repair the windows also.

Donetsk Ministry -- The Donetsk Ministry has a new church, and needs help to finish paying off the loan obtained to build the church. A motion was made to give \$4000 to Donetsk Ministries for the purpose of paying off this loan. The motion was seconded and passed.

Church Yard -- The church yard is not looking as maintained as it should. The church needs to look into improving the appearance of the grass and the bushes. The church may need to look into a professional lawn service if the maintenance does not improve.

Church sign -- The church sign on the top front of the building needs to come down, as part of it is already peeling off.

Bible Conference -- Applications to attend Bible Conference in July are on the table by the side door. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

Outreach Sing -- It has been mentioned before that the church could have an Outreach Sing. Should we try to go ahead and set a date? After some discussion, it was decided that the activities committee would get together to coordinate the best time for this activity.

With no further discussion, Brother Langley made a motion to adjourn conference. It passed.


